





Measure B

People's Ordinance Reform

NAIOP-supported Measure B amends the People's Ordinance, a 100-year-old law that provides free trash pickup for most single family residences. Commercial properties, condos, and residents living on private streets do not receive the free service.

A 'Yes' vote would institute a fee for trash pickup, bringing San Diego in line with most CA cities that charge for the service. Proponents of Measure B say it would even the playing field for commercial properties and bring in additional revenue to the city, increasing recycling pickups to once a week and bringing in millions of dollars that could be used on services like road repair, parks, and public safety staffing.

Measure D

Project Labor Agreements

Measure D would allow the City of San Diego to require project labor agreements (PLA) for city-funded construction projects, eliminating a current voter-approved ban on the requirement.

A 'Yes' vote would remove the ban, which proponents argue would require fair wages to be paid to workers involved with city projects. Proponents claim that San Diego is at risk of losing state funding by banning project labor agreements, as a recent state law dictates that charter cities with PLA bans will be denied state funding. Opponents challenge this assertion and state that use of PLA's discriminate against a large percentage of the construction workforce, including underrepresented minorities.
